performance installation for one or more performers

This piece is for two or more performers in any indoor environment with outdoor objects.

Performance materials are collected from the local environment *stones, seeds, leaves...*

None of the objects have any visible evidence of human modification *manufacturing, carving, polishing...*

The collected objects are arranged into piles based primarily on appearance no piles having both seeds and stones

Each pile is distinct
only one pile of leaves
...but maybe...
a pile of small pebbles & a pile of large rocks
a pile of shale & a pile of granite

The piles are...

as far from one another as possible

&

near corners

Performers can enter and leave at any time.

In performance

constantly producing sound
all sounds made with the objects in the piles
most sounds continuous
sustaining, rattling, grinding, scraping...
inaudible at other piles
occasional punctuations
brief
loud

not...

speaking to others destroying anything outside of the piles

...but maybe...

the objects in the piles are broken & altered

Before leaving or moving to another pile the arrangement of the objects in a pile must be significantly altered piled higher, spread out flat, placed in one continuous line...

If...

Two or more performers find themselves at the same pile,

performance begins collaboratively nonverbal slowly diverges: different means of sound production division of the pile (substations)

Two or more performers find themselves at substations of the same pile,
the division is exaggerated:
sound production, location, appearance...
